## Maintenance Team Notes 03 April 2024

The Maintenance Team Director (Greg Corbett), SSC President (Joe Gelinas) and the Financial Officer (Rochelle Renner) met on Wednesday 3 April 2024 to discuss past, present and future maintenance budget matters for the Santa's Senior Center (SSC). A thorough assessment of past expenses, monthly utility costs and upcoming maintenance items were discussed at length.

The good news is that currently it appears the past years upgrades to the SSC have made a small but noticeable reduction in fuel oil usage. This will hope-fully continue and provide slight monetary savings over the next few years. Water and electrical usage have stayed relatively the same over this same period.

Upcoming required maintenance items were brought to the committee: #1. Replacement of the front lanai corner post, new concrete base foundation, and leveling the roof. Trost construction has placed a bid and timeline for this project. Monies from the gaming fund will be used to complete the project this summer season.

#2. Removal and replacement of the broken drain line behind the SSC. Alaska Drilling & Dirt Works have submitted their estimate for this repair. The SSC board will be presented with the information at the April meeting to discuss and decide how we want to proceed. Again, monies from gaming will be used if the board moves forward with the suggested repairs.

#3. Painting the outside of the SSC has been proposed. The maintenance team is looking into working with the local Painters Union to repair and paint the outside of the building to present a better aesthetic appearance. The SSC would be required to purchase all supplies and materials, with the local union supplying the labor.

#4. Normal annual maintenance requirements, inspections, and costs were presented to the committee, i.e.; furnace tune up, vent range hood cleaning, fire suppression inspection, HVAC filter replacement, smoke detectors, quarterly kitchen inspection, snow plowing, and upgrades/improvements. All items were noted and what the annual cost was for normal upkeep to the SSC.

Reviewing the past several years expenses and proposed maintenance items required a lot of thought, investigation and discussion. It is very important to understand the importance of gaming money to the SSC. Current income from dues and fund raising cannot support all of the required infrastructure. The maintenance team submitted their proposals and requirements to the budget committee. We will make every effort to keep costs below previous years' expenses.



### April Volunteer of the Month Rochelle Renner


